

## IF YOU OBSERVE A CYANOBACTERIA BLOOM...

## DO NOT DRINK THE WATER! DO NOT WADE OR SWIM IN THE WATER! KEEP PETS AND LIVESTOCK OUT OF THE WATER!

- 1 2 3 4 5 6
  - 1. CALL NHDES TO REPORT A SCUM: (603) 848-8094.
  - **2.** Take a picture and estimate the area covered by the bloom.
  - 3. Collect a sample of the scum:
    - Use a clean plastic ziplock bag or bottle.
    - Place it on ice until it can be delivered to NHDES.
    - Note the specific location where the sample was taken.
    - Wash your hands.
  - **4.** Deliver the sample to the NHDES Limnology Center in Concord.
  - **5.** A NHDES Limnologist will identify the sample and notify you with the results.
  - 6. If the identified cyanobacteria are a species of concern, NHDES will post an advisory for the lake and/or beach, as necessary.
